Friends of the San Antonio Public Library **Board Meeting**

Sunday, January 22, 2017 Submitted by Nancy Gandara, Secretary

The Board of the Friends of the San Antonio Public Library met on Sunday, Jan. 22, 2017, at the Central Library. President **Karen Matson** called the meeting to order at 2:06 p.m. Secretary **Nancy Gandara** called the roll and declared that a quorum was present.

Other Friends members in attendance included: Jesse T. Valdez (Pan American); Yolanda Kirkpatrick, Frank & Linda Faulkner (Texana); Delores Huber (Guerra); Linda Arronge (Las Palmas); Pat Finley & James Drury (Brook Hollow); Pam & John Longoria, (Collins Garden); Roy Braswell (Tobin); Diane Duesterhoeft (Memorial); Fave Halford (Semmes, TO, BH); and Maria L. Acebedo.

Approval of Minutes: It was moved and seconded to accept the Minutes of the meeting of Nov. 22, 2016, as printed in the January/February 2017 issue of *SAPLings*; the motion passed.

President's Report: Karen Matson reviewed the numerous events of 2016 that had been significant for San Antonio and ones that the Friends had celebrated or accomplished. These included an orientation for new board members, the

BookCellar's "Silver Cellarbration," the workshop for branch group officers, and the re-activation of several branch Friends groups. Ms. Matson tied several of the events to three surprise drawings, and awarded gifts to three lucky attendees.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Bev Duran presented the Treasurer's Report of December 31, 2016. During 2016, the Friends contributed a total of **\$144,655** to the San Antonio Public Library: \$55,960 was donated by FOSAPL, and branch groups donated \$88,695 to their respective library branches. It was moved and seconded that the Treasurer's Report be accepted, which passed. Ms. Duran also reviewed the 2017 budget which the board had approved at the Nov. 22 meeting: she noted that funds had been included to engage a bookkeeper, whose services were now necessary in order to maintain the 30 individual accounts for branch groups, FOSAPL and the BookCellar.

FEATURED SPEAKER

Kathy Donellan, Assistant Library Director for Support Services, reviewed the many ways that the Library uses funds that are donated by the Friends. Through use of a video that used photos of library users as well as statistics (e.g., circulation, programs conducted, attendance, etc.), Ms. Donellen demonstrated how SAPL is "Changing Lives, Every Day" and emphasized that the funds donated by FOSAPL allow staff to attend a variety of conferences and classes for professional development that have an immediate benefit. She also showed a

video that had been made by staff to publicize and promote "San Antonio's hidden gem," the BookCellar.

LIAISON REPORTS

Jean Brady, representing the Library Board of Trustees, introduced fellow Trustees in attendance. Lora Eckler and Margarita DeLeón. Ms. Brady thanked the Friends for their support during the recent **Bond Projects Committee** meetings and reviewed the Library items that have been included in the proposed Bond Election that was recently approved by the City Council. She pointed out that the emphasis will be on renovating and upgrading existing library facilities (rather than new construction), and she urged the Friends to take an active part in promoting the passage of the bonds in May.

Tracev Bennett, President of the SAPL Foundation, noted several recent accomplishments and upcoming challenges for the Foundation: they awarded \$1 million to the Library in 2016, and they have been doing fundraising for the Schaefer Branch, which will open in the Spring. They have committed to raising matching funds for the renovation and improvement of the Texana/Genealogy Dept. if \$700,000 is made available through the Bond election. Ms. Bennett also reminded the Friends that the San Antonio Book Festival will be held on April 8 and urged them to volunteer and/or attend an event related to the SABF.

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than \$900 was collected in the donation box during 2016. He also asked that those board members involved with a branch group ensure that the members of their group learn and adhere to the policy regarding donations of materials from the BookCellar (for sale at branches): the policy was detailed in *SAPLings* Jan/Feb 2017 issue.

Membership Secretary — Linda Cheatum noted that 67 new members have joined in 2017 but that 296 have not yet renewed their 2016 membership. A second request letter will be sent to those persons in early Feb. Currently, there are 1,025 members (2016 and 2017) in the database.

Nominating Committee — Chair **Bob Mason** thanked the members of the committee, and noted that the proposed slate of officers and board members for the 2017–2019 term had been printed in the Jan/Feb issue of SAPLings.

Arts & Letters Awards — Jose Duran noted that a sheet was available for volunteers for the 2017 Awards committee, and reiterated that the committee would consider any qualified person, without regard to ethnicity, for future awards.

NEW BUSINESS

Approval of the revised bylaws of the Friends of the Texana/Genealogy Collection — The motion was made, seconded, and passed without discussion.

Election of New Officers and Board Members for 2017-2019

— Bob Mason stated that the election of officers would be held first, and he read the names of those standing for election and then called for any additional nominations from the floor: there were no additional nominations, so he called for a motion to close the nominations, which passed. He asked for a motion to elect the slate of officers as pre-

sented, which was made and seconded, and passed unanimously. Elected were: President, Nancy Gandara; Vice-President, Kim Cauthon; Treasurer, Linda Cheatum; Secretary, Beth Graham. The Friends will change authorized signers on the bank accounts (ending in 8736, 8659, and 4644), removing Linda

Arronge and Beverly Duran from all accounts and adding Nancy Gandara and Linda Cheatum.

Mr. Mason read the names of board members standing for election, and asked for additional nominations from the floor; there being none, he asked for a motion to close the nominations, which passed. A motion was made to accept the slate of proposed board members, and it passed unanimously.

President Gandara expressed her gratitude and enthusiastically noted several projects requiring Friends' participation during 2017, including: needing volunteers to assist the Texas Library Association Conference to be held in S.A. from April 19–22; advocating for the passage of the Bond Election on May 6; transitioning to use of a bookkeeper and training for each branch group treasurer; development of a more robust membership recruitment campaign; and development of a mobile-phonefriendly version of the Friends' website. She then awarded framed certificates of appreciation for their leadership and service to Linda Cheatum, Beverly Duran, Bob Mason, and Karen Matson, noting that they all would continue to be involved with the FOSAPL board.

ADJOURNMENT

After expressing her appreciation for the refreshments that had been provided by the Friends of the Collins Garden Branch, President Gandara adjourned the

Library Improvements Included in the 2017–2022 Bond Election

Based on the recommendations of 160 people who served on committees that studied the future needs of San Antonio, the Mayor and City Council selected ballot-measures for an \$850 million General Obligation Bond Program. On May 6, 2017, voters will decide on six separate Propositions to fund improvements to streets, bridges, drainage, flood control, parks, public safety facilities, etc. "Proposition 4" includes 13 projects that would rehabilitate and improve libraries and community centers. Library projects include:

- Central Library (first floor re-envisioning and Children's area transformation)—\$3 million
- Texana & Genealogy Resource Center Project—\$700,000, plus leveraged private funds raised by the San Antonio Public Library Foundation
- McCreless Branch Library renovation—\$2.5 million
- Memorial Branch Library renovation—\$3.3 million
- Las Palmas Branch Library renovation—\$1.7 million
- Forest Hills Branch Library renovation—\$900,000

There will also be a free writing workshop for teens, facilitated by the Barrio Writers, in the Teen Library at Central.

They took on the task of seeking out and mailing books to small schools, community centers, and families in Honduras. They found outlets throughout Central Texas, which made their task manageable. After a December purchase at the BookCellar, Steve thanked us for contributing to "his cause" by helping the group exceed their "50,000 book" milestone.


