Call to Order: Linda Nairn, President, called the meeting to order at 2:10 p.m.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

REPORTS:

President's Report: Linda Nairn reported that she and Cathy Dean traveled to Dallas in April to the Texas Library Association conference. The meetings Linda and Cathy attended were those for Library Friends, Trustees and Advocates. One topic of discussion was people's use of the internet and how to monitor it at libraries. San Antonio is issuing a plan for how to handle this as San Antonio wants to be prepared. Many new ideas were shared on how to advertise for summer reading programs. Linda reported that LIFTA sponsored a luncheon and **Jenna Bush** was there to sign her book for all who attended the luncheon. Linda met with the Collins Garden Friends Group and Richard Morales, President. On a personal note, Linda shared the news that her grandson had his first birthday.

Treasurer's Report:
Nancy Gandara distributed a report as of April 30, 2008.
The Treasurer's Report was accepted and filed for audit.

Library Board: Linda
Nairn reported for Jean
Brady (who was out of town). Jean has done a lot of work with advocacy and has presented the proposed budget for the library. She asks that we all contact our city council members to ask them to please put the library at the top of the list for budget priorities.

Library Foundation: Linda Nairn reported for Sarah Swinney (who was out of town). Sarah reminded us of The Big Read program, which will be Fahrenheit 451 and will kick off March and April of 2009. **Beth Graham** will be attending the orientation in June. An NEA grant was given for travel for color posters for a traveling exhibit. The color posters are part of those archived at the SAPL (40 of them!). They were printed by the U.S. government during WWI to promote patriotism. It is entitled The Winds and Words of War: Posters and Prints from the San Antonio Library Collection. The opening reception will be held October 2 from 6-8 p.m. There will be a series of lectures and film and a musical tribute to WWI as well. The exhibition will then begin its national tour in Chicago, Illinois.

Library Administration: Kendra Trachta, Interim Assistant Director for Public Services, thanked the Friends for its support of The Big Read Program, which is really well supported by everyone.

This is the middle of the budget season. The Board has approached City Council for more money for library materials, additional staffing, facilities that are in need of some repairs; technology computers that are outdated and there are not enough computers.

Trachta reported that the Landa Branch opened May 2. The Conservancy will maintain the grounds. Cody Branch received \$500,000 from Councilwoman Cibrian to replace the roof, carpet, and air conditioning.

The projects that were funded in the '07 bonds are moving quickly, as many of them are library projects. The Book Club Kits are popular. The kits contain a notebook, several copies of a book, questions for discussion, etc.

The library is receiving a new Book Mobile. It is purple and has the library logo on both sides.

A new Outreach Department is being formed. It is taking the basic library services out to people.

June 19—The Forest Hills Branch will host a discussion on Coahuiltecan and other Texas Indians.

The Summer Reading Club is off and running with three weekly programs on Tuesdays: StoryTime, Backpack Power Hour, and Teen Space. These programs are averaging 20, 40, and 10 attendees respectively, per week. Outreach to elementary schools to promote Summer Reading included all-day visits to five schools, reaching over 2,700 students and teachers. Attendance at the Summer Reading Kickoff Party numbered about 88, and as of Thursday, June 12, 479 children and teens had signed up for the Summer Reading Club. Programs are targeting teens and include origami, gaming sessions with the new Playstation 2, craft times and the creation of an anime club.

Further outreach to a senior center to promote library services reached about 70 mature adults, and expanded outreach to this demographic is planned for after Summer Reading concludes.


