### 2007 FOSAPL Library Contributions

uring 2007, the Friends of the San Antonio Public Library contributed more than \$126,180 to the San Antonio Public Library.

The "umbrella" organization of the Friends provided \$40,000 for Programming support—for programs held in the Central Library and all of the branches, appealing to people of all ages and interests.

Another \$40,000 was dedicated to staff training and travel, which we think is so important for professional growth and employee morale.

About \$325 was given to the Library in memory of deceased members of the Friends of the Library, so that they—our "Life" members—might live on through books in the Library's collection.

There are 14 groups of Friends affiliated with different branches and 2 special interest groups [Texana/Genealogy and the Writer Friends]. Their contributions to their libraries totaled \$45.850.

Those contributions included necessities—such as a refrigerator/freezer, a clock for a meeting room, a coffee pot for staff, a renovated reference desk for the Tobin at Oakwell branch, and steno chairs for staff.

Other "bricks and mortar" items purchased for the branches included multimedia projectors, folding tables, magazine display racks, end-of-range bins, carpet, a paper shredder, book trucks, a floor cleaning machine, an electronic typewriter, a CD/cassette "boom box" and—not to forget a

very important and noticeable gift, landscaping at the Brook Hollow branch.

But some branch groups also contributed specific support for programming, such as craft supplies, storytellers, a magician, a clown, a series of guitar classes, a "singing zoologist," books in honor of speakers, and a lecturer who spoke gave "An Intro to Chicano Art."

The Friends of the San Antonio Public Library are glad to show how much we support this Library system, and we look forward to another year of good friendship in 2008.

# Friends of the San Antonio Public Library ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

### Central Library - January 20, 2008

No roll call was taken.

Call To Order: Linda Nairn, President, called the meeting to order at 2:04 p.m. in the Central Library Auditorium.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as reported.

President's Report: Linda stated that the John Igo Branch Library had opened and several people have joined the Igo Friends Group. Charter members will receive a book from John Igo. An initial meeting of the Igo Friends Group has been scheduled for February 16 at 10 a.m. Linda reported that the Landa Library Friends group has not yet been formed. Linda's goal during her presidency is to have each branch library form a Friends group, but that goal has not yet been attained. Branch managers have asked us to start Friends groups at Landa, Collins Gardens, San Pedro, and Cortez.

**Treasurer's Report:** Nancy Gandara distributed copies of her report through December 31, 2007. Nancy stated the Compass Bank Money Market account had been opened at the end of September 2007. The Money Market Gold account at Guaranty Bank is presently receiving 4.1% interest. The checking account earns no interest. Nancy stated some of the Friends groups had made purchases. The Johnston branch purchased a projector; Oakwell purchased a new Reference Desk; and McCreless purchased a projector, a vacuum cleaner, and gift cards for the branch staff. There were various memorials and honorariums at year's end. Nancy stated that FOSAPL had given \$80,325.00 to the library and the branch groups had given \$45,855.00 to their various libraries for a total of \$126,180.00.

Linda Nairn and Nancy Gandara will be at the Library Administration Board meeting on January 23 at 4:30 p.m. to make a presentation and Linda asked for eight volunteers to be present at that meeting to help.

#### **REPORTS:**

Library Administration:
Jessica Ramos thanked the
Friends for all of their support,
as it is truly appreciated. There
are two new branch coordinators: Barbara O'Hara and Joel
Bangalan. Mark Gretchen is
temporarily assigned to Asset
Management and will be retiring shortly. Jessica distributed
the City of San Antonio
Reports. Jessica reminded us of
the January 23 meeting of the
Library Administration.

Library Board: Jean Brady, Chairman of the Library Board Trustees, thanked the Friends for their services. Jean stated the big push for the Board this year is advocacy. They have formed an advocacy committee. There have been two meetings to date. The main push is to raise the visibility of the library system with everyone—education, literacy, and economic development. A new strategic plan is being worked on. Two new libraries will be built, one in District 3 and one in District 9. There are numerous bond initiatives for renovating some of the facilities.

Library Foundation: Sarah Swinney announced that at the end of December 2007, the John Igo Library was opened. Various Library Foundation board members have raised \$50,000.00 for landscaping services for the Igo Branch. It is the Foundation's 25th anniversary and the Foundation is working to get additional corporate literacy partnerships. Sarah stated that one of the goals is to raise Ten Million Dollars over the next four years. The Botero exhibit was a success. The "Caballo" sculpture is due to arrive in spring for display. The NEA BIG READ initiative will kick off in March highlighting To Kill a Mockingbird with various celebrations. For more information and calendar events, go to the neabigread.org website.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Book Cellar: Aaron Konstam reported that the Book Cellar had income of over \$83,700.00 and credited the combined effort of all the volunteers. It has had a relatively successful program of getting new volunteers, but more volunteers are desperately needed. Volunteers get discounts on purchases of books and free parking.

*Membership:* Claudia Kohler reported that FOSAPL currently has 887 memberships paid to date. Second renewal notices will be sent out in February.

### The Big Read: Share and Explore

an Antonio Public Library is celebrating The Big Read in March and April. This National Endowment for the Arts program replaces our One Book~One San Antonio program. Our community novel for 2008 is *To Kill a Mocking-bird* by **Harper Lee**.

To Kill a Mockingbird speaks through the candor of a young tomboy named Scout, who is drawn to and repelled by Boo Radley's haunting isolation, and is increasingly moved by the civil injustice she observes. An eloquent classic, To Kill a Mockingbird won the Pulitzer Prize in 1961. If you haven't read the book,



you simply must—and if it's been a few years, prepare to be surprised by new insights. *To Kill a Mockingbird* is a great book to share. Join one of our many book discussion groups for a lively conversation.

We have special guests and events throughout March and April. Several branches will feature a Magik Theatre performance based on the novel. **Dr. Claudia Johnson**, a Harper Lee scholar, will offer her insights into the novel's historical and literary significance. **Mary Badham**, the actress who played Scout in the 1962 award-winning film, will lead a discussion about her role in the movie. The Big Read event calendars will be available soon, so please stop by your library or check out our website for more information on our book discussion groups, special guests, dramatic performances and movie screenings.




